THE NBS

STEEL ON ICE is a member club in the National Brotherhood of Skiers. Founded in 1973, the NBS is a



non-profit organization that unites predominately African American ski clubs under a national banner. The NBS is the largest ski organization in the world, around 7,000 African Americans participate in over 75 clubs.

THE NBS MISSION

The mission is to identify, develop, and support athletes of color who will win international and Olympic winter sports competitions representing the United States and increase participation in winter sports.

THE BROTHERHOOD

The NBS organizes and sponsors a week long convention (or Summit) at a major ski area. This convention is highlighted by recreational skiing, races, seminars, and social events. Members of NBS clubs from all over the country enjoy these annual reunions. The NBS Eastern Region, of which STEEL ON ICE is a member, holds an annual Winterfest (or extended weekend event) at a major eastern ski resort. This event brings together more than 20 clubs from the East coast.

THE CLUB SPIRIT

All events are driven by our members. Our winter and summer activity calendars are developed by our executive board and members. The success of the club is measured by the participation of its members. Our members have ample opportunity to get involved and attend events local, national, and international events.

LEARN TO SKI

We support new skiers. We give advice on clothes and equipment. We travel to resorts together and obtain group discounts. Our early season learn-to-ski day has become a STEEL ON ICE tradition.

CLUB HISTORY

STEEL ON ICE was formed in 1988 by 16 charter members, all with a devotion to the sport of alpine skiing. We were voted as a member club in the NBS in 1989. As a club, we have attended all NBS Summits and Minisummits since 1989 including: Steamboat, Lake Tahoe, Park City, Copper Mountain, Vail,



As a member of the Eastern Region of the NBS, STEEL ON ICE hosted the Eastern Region Presidents Meetings in 1992 and 2001, and chaired the Eastern

Region Winterfest twice.

OUR ORGANIZATION

The Club is run by an elected group of officers: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, and Recording Secretary, as well as appointed committee chairs: Youth, Safety, Activities & Fundraising, Membership, Racing, and Website.

Formal by-laws ensure consistent practices.
